
- -\$2.3 million in grants supporting 100 member organizations in 39 states

COMPETITION BUILDS CHARACTER

THE THRILL OF VICTORY IS NOW AVAILABLE TO MORE ADAPTIVE ATHLETES THAN EVER!

Sports have the power to change the world, pushing people further and bringing people closer. Competition builds character, developing in athletes the dedication, self confidence and resilience that translates into all areas of their lives.

2023 was a gold medal year for Move United's Sanctioned Competition Series, which reached more than 1,500 athletes through 26 summer sports competition events in 22 states. This year, 15 unique sports were offered to athletes representing 46 states. Move United Sanctioned Competitions are among the best adaptive multi-sport competitive events in the U.S. and are sanctioned by Move United and National Governing Bodies (NGBs).

Each year, the Move United Sanctioned Competition Series culminates in The Hartford Nationals. This year, The Hartford Nationals, the nation's largest multi-sport, multi disability national championship event for athletes with a disability, expanded to include adults.

Nearly 400 athletes from 35 states and 42 Move United Member Organizations competed in seven sports and participated in ten clinics during the week-long event, which has been running since 1957. A wide range of education sessions as well as a Para College Recruiting Showcase was also offered to athletes.

REBUILDING LIVES THROUGH SPORTS

As the nation's leading provider of adaptive sports to wounded warfighters, Move United continues to develop and expand programming to support wounded, injured and ill veterans and service members. This year, the Move United Warfighters program served nearly 1,400 unique warfighters through over 100 adaptive sports programs held around the country.

This year, the development and launch of Move United Warfighter internships provided warfighters real-life work experinces in the field of adaptive sports, In addition, The Hartford Nationals expanded to include warfighters this year, and special recruitment of warfighters in the Adaptive Shooting League and USA Wheelchair Football League led to the expansion of those sports.

Warfighter Ambassadors provided a range of sports and programmatic support, including event work, outreach, sports mentorship, and sponsor relations.

















EDUCATION

INVESTING IN ADAPTIVE SPORTS LOCALLY. NATIONALLY, AND DIGITALLY

Move United launched the Education Hub, a web-based portal bringing the adaptive sports community the range of education and training needed to provide the highest quality, safest sports programming possible. The Education Hub is a best-in-class and fully accessible learning management system that allows Move United to deliver critical knowledge to its membership network and partners at any time, on any device –empowering adaptive sport professionals to perform their best, increase expertise and skill, and deepen the commitment and contribution to our industry. By the end of the year, more than 20 courses were made available.

In-person training was provided around the country to more than 600 individuals across twelve sports, through partnerships with thirty Move United Member Organizations and ten national sports organizations, including USA Archery, National Park Service, American Canoe Association, USA Para Powerlifting, and Professional Ski Instructors of America/American Association of Snowboard Instructors.

The 2023 Move United Education Conference, "Disability Inclusion in Sport: Transforming Intent to Action," in Louisville, Kentucky was attended by 260 individuals, and included 33 training sessions and workshops, a poster session and three roundtable discussion groups. The conference provided the tools, training, and conversations to make disability inclusion in sport a reality. This conference challenged attendees to make an impact around inclusion, access & belonging. Nearly half of all attendees were new to Move United education programs, expanding the community.







UNITED WE SHRED

PLENTY OF SNOW AND SMILES AT THE HARTFORD SKI SPECTACULAR!

Move United hosted the 36th annual The Hartford Ski Spectacular at Beaver Run Resort and Breckenridge Ski Resort in Breckenridge, Colorado, marking a celebration that brought together 800 participants, from novices experiencing the thrill of skiing for the first time to elite adaptive athletes. This year, more than 60 warfighters and family members from hospitals and communities across the U.S. also joined in the winter fun. Eighty-five clinics were offered to athletes and instructors who hailed from across the country.

During the event, The Hartford, in collaboration with celebrated athletes such as Oksana Masters and Keith Gabel, surprised 13 deserving athletes with custom-fit adaptive sports equipment. This was the culmination of a year that saw The Hartford give more than 700 pieces of sports equipment to Move United member organizations and athletes, including 50 surprise equipment donations.


The event also featured a collaboration with the town's Ullr Fest, where Move United participated with a float in the annual parade and hosted the "Race for everyBODY" at Breckenridge Ski Resort, an inclusive race that welcomed both adaptive athletes and the general public. The event was a spectacular display of strength, perseverance, and joy, uniting athletes of all abilities in a shared love for winter sports.

For decades, The Hartford Ski Spectacular has not only showcased athletic prowess but also served as a critical training ground for adaptive snow sports programs nationwide, furthering the expertise of instructors in adaptive ski and snowboard techniques. PUSH WHAT'S

WHEELCHAIR FOOTBALL IS ADAPTIVE SPORTS NEWEST TEAM SPORT!

The USA Wheelchair Football League (USAWFL) grew substantially this year to more than 300 athletes on 14 teams competing in three regional tournaments leading to the national championship. This growth included adding almost 220 warfighter football players. This year an approved classification system for teams was designed and will be implemented in 2024.

The USAWFL is the first of its kind football league for adults with disabilities to reach their highest potential through a competitive, fast-paced, team sport. The league brings together highly trained coaches with passionate athletes, building skills and inspiring athletes to excel both on and off the field through teamwork, dedication, and resilience. Founded in 2019, the USAWFL is made possible thanks to generous support from the NFL-Bob Woodruff Foundation Salute to Service partnership "Healthy Lifestyles and Creating Community" grant as well as Xenith.

Since 2020, Move United has helped more than 850 athletes and coaches get off the sidelines and get in the game through learn-to-play clinics, practice and development opportunities, camps, scrimmages and tournaments. PLANTING THE SEEDS OF INCLUSION

This past year was an exciting year with the expansion of Move United's Inclusive Playbook materials, a one-of-a-kind tool promoting inclusion in the classroom. To date, more than 175,000 kids have been reached.

The Inclusive Playbook is a free, 24 page, interactive workbook created for children in pre-K through 6th grade focusing on disability awareness and adaptive sport. It is accompanied by a two page interactive Inclusive Playmat for early understanding and learning.

This year, four unique Inclusion Playbook Courses were launched on Move United's Education Hub and the Inclusion Playbook materials and curriculum were presented at seven national conferences to wide acclaim.

ATHLETE HIGHLIGHTS

WARFIGHTERS AMBASSADOR LONNIE BEDWELL

A U.S. Navy veteran, Lonnie Bedwell was critically injured in a hunting accident that instantly took his sight. Lonnie has kayaked some of the most challenging whitewater in the world and is responsible for first blind descents of Africa's fabled Zambezi River and West Virginia's world-renowned Gauley River. Lonnie is also known for his first-ever blind descent of the 226-mile Colorado River through the Grand Canyon. Lonnie has climbed Mt. Kilimanjaro and Denali. He rock climbs and is an avid downhill skier.

In May 2023, Lonnie became the fourth blind person to ever summit Mount Everest, the highest point on Earth at 29,000 feet, an expedition Move United supported. Lonnie's mission is to motivate others to embrace life with confidence and courage. Lonnie is a Move United Warfighters ambassador and dedicated to helping people enjoy full lives and, while he is an advocate for the blind, blindness does not define either him or his efforts on behalf of others.

KATY MADDRY

Katy was born with Fibular Hemimelia, resulting in a below-the-knee amputation. In the 5th grade her mom signed her up for an adaptive race program at Challenge Alaska, a Move United chapter. At first, she was not a fan of snowboarding because of all the falling left and right. But at age 20, she had a change a heart and now loves the sport!

Snowboarding has provided countless opportunities to her in more countries than she can count! In 2022, Katy placed 12th in the snowboard cross. She says about the games, "not only was it a dream come true, but has also taught me what I need to improve on and where my weaknesses are." She is presently a fulltime Architect student at the University of Alaska.




